Revenge plot crime novel, 'Itoh's Ghost,' recalls black, white Kurosawa-style films

WESTERVILLE, Ohio – Author Eric Rentschler plots a crime noir against the backdrop of human experimentations carried out by the Japanese during World War II in his intriguing debut novel, "Itoh's Ghost" (published by iUniverse).
